Also accessed from this main artery are a well thought out and designed set of trails that will provide you quick and quiet access to almost every point of the property. Along these trails, they will lead you to the incredible feeder and stand sites that are set among the additional 5 food plots. The commitment to raising healthy and mature deer includes a year-round food supply of various feeds and a protein supplement. The current owner even went so far as to supply buckets of water to every feeder site that have been filled twice a week. The topography of the farm is gently rolling hills that are covered with oaks, cedars, thickets, and very thick native grasses that combined, serve as unlimited bedding areas for the wildlife in the area. Aside from the impressive number of whitetail deer on this farm, there are turkeys and wild hogs that are frequently seen on the farm as well. In the southwest corner of the farm, you will find a solar-powered water well that is left running for all of the wildlife to catch a drink at. Next to this well, there is an old corral with a nice lean-to that would serve to be a great place for storage. There is also electricity ran to this site and with little work, it could be turned into the perfect place to set up camp. 




AERIAL MAP




OVERVIEW MAP


