From a hunting perspective, this piece lays out perfectly and the approximately 66 acres of tillable functions as a massive food source drawing deer from all directions. This ground is perfectly placed between thick lowland to the west and mature timber and a corn field to the east. In fact, it is almost impossible to walk any distance on this ground without stepping on a deer track. This neighborhood has grown multiple whitetails in excess of 180 inches.

The gradual elevations that characterize the tillable, especially the back forty, allow one to visualize the potential after properly placing some tower stands for safe, effective hunting that would work for hunters of all ages and abilities. The edges of the two ponds

on the property are absolutely torn up with deer sign and provide that year-round water source essential for wildlife. There is plenty of timber to hang that strategic archery set on the west line. The property offers much more cover than the aerial image may depict. The grasses, tag alders, pine trees, ditches, and fence lines offer security for the deer and provide proper access points for the hunter.

What is more, there is a potential building site with paved road access on the south providing an opportunity to create the hobby farm of your dreams. The view to the north is sure to bring peace should one desire to build here. This property lies only twenty minutes south of Marshfield and less than ten minutes east of Pittsville. The southeastern 1.5 acres with a metal pole shed could potentially be available.






AERIAL MAP




TOPOGRAPHY MAP
