Set at the end of a quiet, dead-end county road, the property offers privacy and wide-open views across 370 +/- acres with no neighbors in sight. The custom home, built in 2022, sits perfectly positioned to overlook the ranch through large picture windows that bring the landscape inside. With approximately 2,530 square feet per tax records, plus a sunroom and additional upstairs room, the 4-bedroom, 2-bath home offers spacious living highlighted by beautiful ceilings, a large kitchen, and a truly impressive pantry designed for everyday life.

The land itself is highly productive and well organized for livestock operations. Approximately 280 +/- acres are in pasture supported by strong native and improved grasses, while about 90 acres of timber provide shade, wildlife habitat, and scenic beauty. Nearly 100 acres are comprised of Class II silt loam soils, and productive bottomland along Leader Creek supports excellent grazing. The ranch is tightly fenced with barbed wire and field fencing—much of it new—and divided into 10 pastures designed for rotational grazing. A solar-powered water well feeds five hydrants across the paddocks, while rural water services the home. Leader Creek winds through the property for roughly 1.3 miles,

offering year-round character to the ranch and even the occasional opportunity to find arrowheads and artifacts along its banks.

Recreation and family enjoyment are just as much a part of this property as its working capability. Two stocked ponds—one approximately 2 acres and another ½ acre—provide great bass fishing and a perfect spot for kids to spend afternoons by the water. The mix of timber, creek bottom, and pasture also supports excellent wildlife habitat with whitetail deer, wild turkey, dove, and waterfowl regularly seen on the property. Infrastructure is equally impressive, with a large 60'x120' barn, a 30'x40' shop with plumbing and electric, a 40'x120' open barn with a concrete floor, and working pens ready for livestock handling.

Located just 11 minutes from Tupelo and 25 minutes from Ada, you're never far from the essentials! The Pontotoc 370 offers the rare opportunity to step into a finished ranch that is ready to operate and enjoy from day one. Whether your vision is running livestock, raising a family in the country, or simply owning a beautiful piece of Oklahoma where hunting, fishing, and ranch life all come together, this property delivers the full package.


